

Did you know... Daylight Saving Time can save energy? Experts studied the impact of Daylight Saving Time on overall energy consumption in the United States. They found that the extra four weeks of Daylight Saving Time saved about 0.5 percent in total electricity each day. If you were to study individual states, you may find different results, but overall, the four-week extension of daylight saved 1.3 billion kilowatt-hours. That amount of electricity could power 100,000 houses for a year! 

Maintenance projects improve reliabilty

Which reliability of the electric service for people in the Bayfield and Cornucopia area. The seven miles are located on inaccessible right-ofway, which greatly increased outage times during large storms.

Another area of concern was the Pigeon Lake area. Due to the rising lake, we rerouted the line serving the members on the north side and moved other infrastructure away from the lake. We also buried a half mile of line on the south side of Highway N. Bayfield Electric and the National Forest System worked together to increase the safety and reliability of power in the area.
