- 6. No signs or handouts will be permitted within the building of the place of the meeting, except such handouts as required for the official conduct of the Annual Meeting

- » Assume all power lines are ENERGIZED and dangerous. Even lines that are de-energized could become energized at any tie.
- » Never touch a downed power line! And never touch a person or object that is touching a power line.
- » If someone is injured as a result of contact with electric current, do not try to assist him or her. You could be injured or killed. Call 911.
- » If a power line falls across your vehicle while you are in it, stay inside until help arrives.
- Call 911 immediately to report a downed power line.
   Then call your electric cooperative.

## ENERGY EFFICIENCY TIP OF THE MONTH

Turn your suds into savings. Lower your energy use in the laundry room by washing clothes with cold water whenever possible, as heating water accounts for most of the energy used in a laundry cycle. Wash full loads to make the most of energy savings, and use highefficiency detergent designed for cold washes. For drying cycles, clean the lint filter before each load to improve airflow and use dryer balls to reduce drving time.
