#### **BAYFIELD LINEMEN ASSIST IN HURRICANE RELIEF**



s part of the sixth Cooperative principle, Cooperation among Cooperatives, and working together through a program called ROPE (Restoration of Power in an Emergency), Bayfield Electric responded to a request from South Carolina for restoration assistance following Hurricane Helene.

Bayfield Electric sent two linemen and a truck to assist. They joined a convoy of linemen and trucks from 14 other Wisconsin co-ops and started the journey to South Carolina. Crews faced challenges with working conditions, widespread damage and changing weather. The crews worked in teams for 16-hour days and slept on cots in tents. Their hard work and efforts brought relief and joy to local residents once they saw their homes and businesses energized once again.
